- Receive assistance to gain work following the traineeship.

Trainees meet at Nerang train station and are transported to work sites in Numinbah Valley. Work activities include native plant propagation, tree planting, bush regeneration and walking track construction and maintenance.

Who can apply?

- Over the age of 15 years;
- Ineligible for Australian Government employment services or assistance; or
- Have accessed Australian Government employment services for more than six months and remain unemployed;
- Have not previously completed a Certificate I in Conservation and Land Management;
- Not currently a full time student at TAFE, University or School;
- Permanent resident of Australia;
- New Zealand citizen permanently residing in Queensland;
- Refugee and Humanitarian Visa Holder living in Queensland; or
- Temporary Visa Holder living in Queensland with the necessary visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency.

Interviews will be held at Workways Robina office.
